



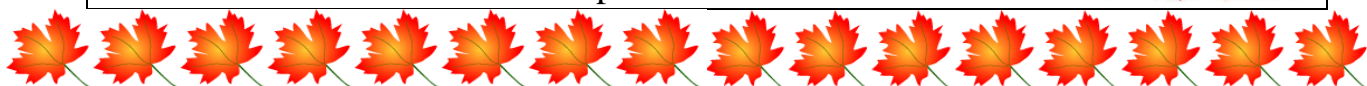

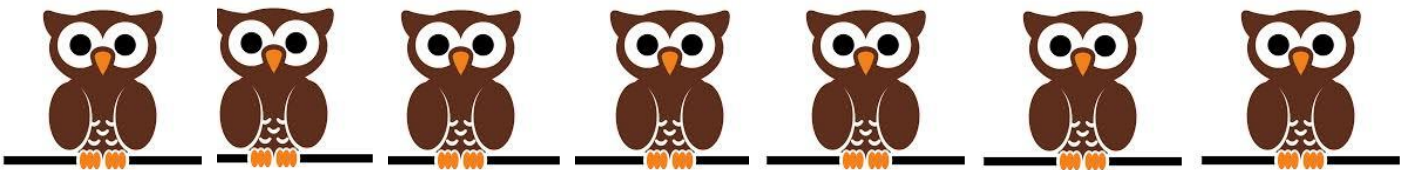

If you are taking your child trick or treating remember a few things.

Keep your kids from getting tripped up on Halloween with costume tips from Kyran Quinland, M.D.

Dress your little trick or treater safely:

Beware of button batteries.

If you're buying an outfit, watch for designs that feature small lights powered by batteries. If the nickel size buttons come loose, they are a choking and poisoning hazard for kids under age 4.

Size things up.

Make sure your child's clothes fit comfortably (no plastic princess heels!) and that her costume isn't dangerously long. Leave pointy props (swords, sticks, brooms) at home; you'll be the one stuck carrying them anyway.

Make him easy to spot

The costume should be bright and reflective; if it's not, add reflective tape to his clothes and bag.

Opt for face paint

Masks can make it harder to see, so use nontoxic makeup or fun hats instead. Just make sure the hat fits snugly so it won't fall over his eyes.
